Since my very first time playing guitar on the bimah—accompanying my cantor in concert at age eleven—music has always intersected with my other great passion: Judaism. Music animates our liturgy and serves as the sacred language of Torah. It delivers poetry and reflects the many cultures that have influenced the Jewish people.

This year, Shir Sinai, our music committee, decided to do something different from bringing in an out-of-town artist-in-residence. Instead, they're

featuring artists from around Atlanta in a "Home-Grown Artist Series"-a year-long celebration of local musicians -to enliven our community.

I'm especially excited to be featured on February 28th, when I'll offer a full concert of original music, a few fun covers, and some multimedia pieces featuring never-before-heard compositions. I've assembled a tenperson ensemble, and I sincerely hope you'll mark your calendars and join us. I also believe deeply that music has the power to heal—in one way or another. I have had the extraordinary blessing of two mothers: the one who raised me and the one who gave birth to me. Both have faced the cruelty of Alzheimer's disease—one before her passing five years ago, and the other still living with it today. To honor them, while the majority of the proceeds from the concert will go to the Sharon Fagin & Goldie Velinsky Morris Music Enrichment Fund, a portion will be donated to Alzheimer's research. I hope, in our lifetime, we can help bring an end to this devastating illness and always find ways for music to be used for good.

"To me, being a Madricha means helping young kids find their Jewish identities and learn about their religion. Judaism has

always been a central part of my identity, largely in part due to the time I spent at Temple Sinai when I was growing up, and it is incredible to be able to help young kids discover who they are and how their religion fits into their identity just as I have.

I participate in the Madrichim program because, for me, it is an incredible opportunity to help young kids learn about and love Jewish tradition in a fun, exciting, and meaningful way. I loved growing up going to temple and going to Noar, and now getting to help other kids experience that same joy is such an amazing feeling. It almost feels more meaningful now, getting to learn about Judaism through the eyes of young kids and more fully appreciating experiences that my younger self may not have.

Through the Madrichim program, I've learned the limitations of what I can control and how to more easily go with the flow. I have learned how to multitask, how to be patient, and how to problem solve, all of which have helped me tremendously in other aspects of my life, whether that be at school, in athletics and extracurricular activities, or in life in general. I have also gained invaluable leadership skills.

One of my favorite memories from being a Madricha is sitting in tefilah, one of my most favorite activities from when I was in Noar, singing, dancing, and having fun with the sweetest little kids!

The Madrichim program has meant so much to me. It has influenced me in ways I can't even begin to imagine and it continues to be one of the most important things in my life!"

Is there anything else you want to share about the committee or your experiences?

Marilyn: For years, I was nervous before a Kesher call ..."What do I say?; "How can I provide comfort when I don't understand why bad things have to happen to good people?" but over the years, I've listened and learned from our clergy and lay leaders and now I get it. Kesher just needs to be there and show up for our congregants in need. It's simple and beautiful at the same time.

Lori: The first time I volunteered for Kesher and delivered a shiva meal, I was greeted by a grieving family with so much appreciation - I could tell it really filled them up in their time of need. I was hooked! Also, I cannot say enough about our Kesher team. We have the best volunteers who go above and beyond for our community. It's a wonderful group of people.

Reflection: SHIELD and the Tzedek Justice Initiative

This past year, Temple Sinai launched its first Temple Sinai Justice Initiative. These congregational initiatives, which are approved

by Board vote and adopted by Temple Sinai, are related to repairing the world. These initiatives address the root cause(s) of inequality by advocating for policy change, feature sustained dialogue and engagement, and/or have implications beyond a single social action program. Laura Zhiss applied for her organization, SHIELD, and shares about her experience here.

When I first learned about Temple Sinai's Tzedek Justice Initiative, it felt almost meant to be. I had just started SHIELD (Supporting Honest Instruction & Equitable Learning for our Diaspora), a grassroots initiative led by parents, educators, and community advocates who believe every Jewish student deserves a classroom free from bias, distortion, and fear. We were knee-deep in our effort to fix problems in the Cobb County Schools'

social studies curriculum, and SHIELD needed a way to grow. I remember reading about this opportunity in Sinai's newsletter and thinking that this could be the bridge we need.

I applied because Sinai isn't just a congregation—it's a caring, hands-on community filled with people who know how to make things happen. I was looking for guidance, support, and partners to help SHIELD move from a few determined parents to something with real reach. After meeting with Rabbi Brad Levenberg last spring, we decided the best first step was to build a website. Thanks to Temple Sinai's generous support, we launched it before the school year began.

That website gave us a foundation and a springboard to reach more families, helping parents understand when and how bias can appear in the classroom. It showed me how much stronger we are when we work together.

This is only the beginning. SHIELD exists to help support families as we work toward classrooms where Jewish and Israeli history are taught accurately and without bias—because when our curriculum is

honest and free from bias, it shapes a safer, more understanding future for every child.

Do you have an idea for a justice initiative? Our Temple Sinai Tzedek Committee has updated its method for selecting congregational initiatives that Temple Sinai adopts related to repairing the world. The new process relies upon member involvement. Any Sinai member can propose a Temple Sinai Justice **Initiative** by filling out and submitting an application that will include the scope of the proposal, the Jewish values aligned with the initiative and ideas for implementation. Israel Is for Us

Baruch Hashem, the living hostages are home from Gaza. But the Israel I experienced this summer, was living a very different reality. It takes only setting foot in Israel to see the scars that October 7th has left on the land and the people. The welcome ramp at Ben Gurion was lined with posters with hostages faces. This is a country of people torn apart by mourning that refuses to lose sight of joy and hope.

We saw more of Eretz Yisrael in seven days than I thought was possible. Through sheer will and determination of Rabbi Tracy Kaplowitz of Steven Wise Free Synagogue, and very little sleep, we spent time in Tel Aviv, the Western Negev (aka the Gaza Envelope), Jerusalem, the Dead Sea, the Golan, and Akko.

I am grateful that, through our exploration, we were blessed not only to see so much but also to hear so many personal stories. There is a deep and varied history of those who live in Israel. We heard the story of an incredible woman whose parents immigrated from Iraq. She now lives near Gaza with the constant threat of Hamas bombs (she calls the shrapnel her presents from Hamas), and she lost a dear friend on October 7th who died protecting their community. We visited the Holocaust Memorial and Museum, telling a story I've

studied my whole life but now reframed as a stark reminder of the value of a safe space. We heard the story of one of the first Jews to make Aliyah from Ethiopia, whose community sacrificed deeply for the opportunity to live freely and retain their heritage. We broke bread with Palestinians who live in Jerusalem and the West Bank. We communally struggled with the cost of security for everyone's ability to live with dignity. We heard the stories from teachers of Ukrainian refugee students finding solace and yet struggling with feeling at home in Israel. We heard these stories, and many, many more, of Israel's diversity, its triumphs, and its struggles.

Today's stories are largely filled with grief: lost friends, soldiers who will never come home, international colleagues who refuse to adequately recognize the horrors of terrorism, a music festival rampaged, the struggle to see the path toward peace, and the deep physical and emotional scars of fighting a war for two years. But Israel is complicated, the word used most frequently on the trip, and wrapped in this pain is the hope and joy of disabled students welcoming Shabbat through song, a father donating engagement rings to soldiers in memory of his son, glasses clinking and laughter echoing in a food hall on a Thursday night, because to be Jewish is to find joy in community, even amidst turmoil and challenges.

On our very last night as a group together in Israel, we stayed at a hotel on a kibbutz

in the Golan on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. The only other people staying there, it seemed, were reservist soldiers returning home from tours of duty. This was a stop of respite to be together before returning home to their day-today lives and jobs. In what felt like an incredible parallel to having cried and mourned so deeply at the beginning of the trip at the Nova Festival memorial, these soldiers thew a wild party full of deep joy filled with laughter, singing, and dancing (and of course plenty of Arak). We were invited to join. A small group of soldiers came over to us ask who we were and why we were there- "Taglit?" [how Israelis refer to birthright trips]. They were stunned by a group of Americans who were 'brave' enough to come to Israel during war times. But this shock was also filled with curiosity. "Isn't it scary to be Jewish in America right now?" one asked. A soldier who has been fighting in a war asked US if it's scary to live our lives right now. "Yes, sometimes," we all acknowledged. "You know, we're fighting for you, too," he replied.

As we danced and laughed with these soldiers late into the evening, probably too late for our early departure the next morning, it struck me deeply: Israel is for me. It's a safe place to be my whole, Jewish self. And it's for you, too. God willing, because of the struggle, and determination, and hope, and joy of Am Yisrael, it will continue to be for us whenever we need it. Today is a beautiful day to be a Zionist.

What is that emotional tug – that stirring in our hearts – we so often feel when we walk around Temple Sinai?

That was the question emerging from a conversation between Rabbi Segal and Berylann Strada in 2021 as Covid briefly subsided and congregants started returning to the building. Rabbi Segal assembled a small group to meander through the building, and it was quickly apparent that specific places and objects evoked strong feelings and spiritual connections.

An idea was born: to create a self-guided tour highlighting those meaningful objects and spaces.

Time passed, and the idea resurfaced in 2023, when Michelle Young, then Vice President of Spiritual Life, connected

with Berylann. "If These Walls Could Talk" quickly took shape. Michelle and Berylann invited clergy and a group of congregants to help compile a list of spots. An accompanying brochure was envisioned which would include a keyed map of the facility. Much like visiting a museum, visitors would stop at sites identified by QR codes, scan the codes, and read and/or listen to a brief description of each site or item.

In Fall 2024, Sinai's 2024-25 Atidaynu class came on board to develop the content, with Diana Silverman at the helm. Under Diana's leadership, Atidaynu members provided research, delving into the history for each site. Descriptions were written, photos were taken, and the Sinai staff created brochures, music, and signage. Personal reflections from selected congregants were also included.

Diana shared these thoughts as the project was finally launched: "I have received so much from Temple Sinai over the years; this was an opportunity to leave a valuable legacy to our synagogue."

For Berylann, it was a hands-on moment: "The day we put up the QR codes, I knew we had finally crossed the finish line; it was a dream come true."
